As winter settles in and the wind, rain and in some parts of Australia, the snow, sets in remember that pets too can feel the chill despite their fur coats. Many a pet will appreciate an extra blanket or two, and perhaps a heating pad that will make the winter chills disappear. Your pet will be drawn to any heaters that you have on, but just make sure they aren't sitting too close as they may doze off and wake up with serious burns. Nutrition is the name of the game in winter diets. You want your pets to enjoy solid nutrition but don't overdo treats or they may pile on the weight. And keep up with exercise over the cold months. We are all tempted to stay inside where its warm, but come spring, the excess weight becomes a burden to shed, both for pets and owners alike! There are so many pet 'clothing' options, that no pet needs to freeze. Dress them up warmly then go for an invigorating walk—and enjoy winter! Make the most of every cold chilly day.

Rabbits and the Calcivirus. This disease is highly infectious and sadly doesn't have a cure. Prevention is therefore an essential aspect in the management of this condition. This swift acting disease starts with depression and loss of appetite, followed rapidly by a fever, seizures, and coma, leading to their demise within 12—36 hours of the symptoms. An annual vaccination will protect your rabbit from this horrible virus. Other steps you can take include quarantining a new rabbit from others for at least 5 days, provide regular flea treatment to reduce the chance of infection spread from parasites, and keep your rabbits separated from other rabbits that are not within your family. Rabbit calicivirus is also known as viral haemorrhagic disease. The virus is shed through the urine, faeces, and respiratory secretions and is often spread between rabbits by carriers such as fleas, flies, mosquitoes and other rabbits. Talk to us about getting your rabbit vaccinated—prevention is the only option.

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




Ear irritations can drive a pet nuts. There is often discharge from the ear, a smelly odour, and there may be debris in the ears. Your pet will often shake their heads, and paw at their ears. Ear infections can be itchy or painful for your pet. Left alone, an ear infection can cause serious damage. If you try to clean the ear yourself, be very gentle and don't go too far into the ear. If the ear is too painful and your pet gets upset when you try to clean it, please bring them into us. Sometimes an ear infection can be related to a skin allergy. But an ear infection should never be ignored.

A Fractured Femur (hind leg)

These kind of injuries are the most common fracture of the bone seen in dogs or cats. They are often caused by a major trauma such as being hit by a car. The animal is usually unable to use the limb, and the bone may even be exposed through the skin. It depends on the extent of the injury, as to the treatment of the wound. A thorough physical examination is important. Based on the results, additional tests may be recommended. Depending on the fracture type, pins, pins and wires, bone plates and screws, plus external fixators to prevent movement can be used to help your dog or cat heal. X-rays will also be required. As the animal recovers, painkiller medication will be required, and it takes time to heal from such a traumatic experience. All of these things cost money.

Costs can run into the thousands (\$5000 plus) which can be another stressful item the owner has to wear. <u>Pet insurance is</u> designed for these type of major injuries. We hope that you will never have to use it, but if the worse happens, you will be pleased you had the foresight to get accident and injury pet insurance to cover the cost. All Pets Need Mental Stimulation.

When a pet is bored, they often get into trouble. They wreck the new roll of toilet paper and spread the tissue throughout the house. Potted plants become a target to either toss off the table (usually a cat trick) or 'repot' the plant leaving dirt in a pile on your carpet.
